



ARROW MAKING COMPETITION

As part of the Club's annual Safari, there is a competition for the best home-made arrows. You have from now until the Safari to make three (3) identical arrows, which will be judged by two magnificent arrow-makers.

RULES FOR ENTRY

- · All shafts are to be of wood and one piece, however footing at nock and pile ends are allowed and score extra points.
- · 125 grain weight target piles only.
- · Arrows must weigh the same (within 50 grains of each other).
- · Fletches must be of natural feather, be of the same length, and have a minimum of twelve (12) inches of fletch. These can be glued or bound.
- · Centre of gravity must be the same, within a half inch (+ or a quarter inch).
- · Shafts must be straight.
- · Piles and nocks must be on straight and be of the same pattern on all shafts. Arrows may be self-nocked or have plastic nocks.
- · Cresting must be even and match up exactly on all shafts. Cresting is optional; however, it makes for a more attractive arrow and scores more points.
- · Spine must be the same on all shafts (+ or 10 AMO units).
- \cdot All shafts must be the same length and useable (not models).
- · While plastic nocks, gluing of fletches and no cresting are optional, arrows will be judged on skill and aesthetics, so the more traditional and attractive the better.

So, all you arrow-makers out there - get constructing! We want to see as many of you as possible,

There will be an award for the best set of arrows - and of course bragging rights for the successful entrant.
